SUMMARY OF RESPONSES


Curriculum Rating (Q1):


Quality of Education (Q2):

Content Delivery (Q3):



Analysis: Content delivery received positive feedback, with 94% of students rating it as "Good" or better. The presence of an "Average" rating indicates scope for improvement.


Course Curriculum Satisfaction (Q4):


Academic Initiatives Bridging Industry-Academia Gap (Q5):

New Skills Acquisition (Q6):



Analysis: Students reported acquiring new skills beyond the syllabus, with 95% rating their experience as "Good" or better.


Relevance of Degree to Job (Q7):

Analysis: A significant majority (78%) of students considered their degree to be relevant to their present job, while 19% rated it as "Very Good."


Rating of Academic Initiatives for Competence Improvement (Q8):

Development Activities Rating (Q9):



Analysis: Development activities organized by the college were highly rated, with 98% of students rating them as "Very Good" or better.


Motivation for Post-Graduation/Research Pursuit (Q10):
